The Manaslu Circuit Trek is world-renowned due to its captivating peak, Mount Manaslu, the world's eighth-highest mountain. The trek is exceptionally beautiful, taking you through the Manaslu Conservation Area, splendid landscapes, and remote villages in the Gorkha region of Nepal. The trek typically starts from Machhikhola due to the newly constructed road and follows the crystal-clear Budhi Gandaki River through sub-tropical forests, breathtaking cascading waterfalls, and terraced farmland, with stunning views of snow-capped mountains in the distance.

As you ascend higher, the scenery becomes more spectacular with surrounding mountainous views, and the villages become more remote and traditional. You'll pass through Tibetan-influenced villages and see beautiful Buddhist monasteries and prayer flags along the way. The highlight of the trek is the remarkable view of Mount Manaslu and crossing the Larkya La Pass, which is the highest point on the trek at 5,106 meters (16,752 ft) and offers stunning panoramic views of the surrounding mountains. The pass can be challenging due to its steep ascent with a long moraine and glacier trail and descent, as well as the possibility of snow and ice on the trail, so it's important to be properly acclimatized and prepared for the trek. Despite its difficulty, the pass rewards trekkers with an unparalleled beautiful experience.

After crossing the Larkye pass, the trail descends through rocky terrain and an ancient, beautiful silver pine forest to join the beautiful valley of the Marsyangdi River and the world-famous Annapurna Circuit trail. From here, the trail follows the river downstream, passing through charming villages and terraced farmland before ending in the town of Besishahar. The trail is known as a less-treked, unspoiled trail in the world, and is truly a beautiful trail for adventure and culture-loving trekkers.
