The trek starts in the town of Arughat and follows the Buri Gandaki River, passing through lush forests, charming villages, and terraced fields. Along the way, you will see stunning waterfalls, suspension bridges, and ancient monasteries. The trail then ascends to the challenging Larkye Pass, offering breathtaking views of Mt. Manaslu and other snow-capped peaks. After crossing the pass, the trek descends to the Marsyangdi River valley and continues through charming villages and terraced fields before ending in Besisar.
